

COLDWATER CITY COUNCIL
SPECIAL MEETING

September 14, 2022 at 5:00 p.m.

The governing body of the City of Coldwater met in special session for the purpose of the ordering of a new law enforcement vehicle with the following present: Mayor Joe Ceballos, Council members Mike Bushnell, Robert Cardoza and Ashta Rosson, Chief of Police Devon Duffield and City Clerk Kristal Sherman. Council members Cleta Lampe and Britt Lenertz were absent.

Mayor Joe Ceballos called the special meeting to order.

Chief of Police Devon Duffield told the council he has spoke with the representative of the Superior Emergency Response Vehicles out of Andover, Kansas and the 2023 Chevy Tahoe that was originally on order as the new patrol vehicle isn't in production yet and is going to cost a total of \$58,236.93 which is \$5,250.00 more than the estimate that was approved at the July 11th meeting. He said is wouldn't be here until June of 2023 and road ready until September, 2023, and at that price, he wouldn't purchase the new camera system, he would take the camera system out of the current patrol vehicle and use it in the new one. Devon said there is a 2023 Dodge Durango that can be substituted for the Tahoe at a price of \$52,541.93 which is \$5,695.00 cheaper than the Tahoe. He said the Durango can be here by March, 2023 and road ready by May, 2023. After discussion, Ashta made a motion to rescind the motion and vote made at the July 11, 2022 meeting to purchase the 2023 Chevy Tahoe plus new camera system for \$60,000.00, the motion was seconded by Mike and everyone voted Yes. Mike then made a motion the City purchase the 2023 Dodge Durango for \$52,541.93, seconded by Ashta and everyone voted Yes.

With no further business presented, Robert made a motion to adjourn the special meeting, seconded by Ashta and everyone voted Yes.
